Navigators: Ages 8-10 ~ explore the Bible account of the beginning of the world and God's plan to overcome what the impacted this world so that it is no longer perfect. Voyagers: Ages 10-12 ~ discuss God's plans for the world as it was created to be and the consequences of wrong and good choices.
