

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


Last One Standing

Ask the group to stand, then sit as you read a statement that applies to them.

- I can sew on a button
- I often go to church
- I learn a musical instrument
- I love sports
- I have a blue toothbrush
- I speak a language other than English
- I enjoy documentaries about animals
- I can recite part of the Bible
- I have seen under the bonnet of a car
- I have made someone a cup of tea
- Right now my room is tidy
- I have been a patient in hospital
- I have been fishing
- I can draw well





Peril Peg Game






Two Team Quiz Game

You will need four different coloured pegs:

- 5 Green pegs One team will be the green team
- 5 Blue pegs One team will be the blue team
- 1 Pink Peg The "Plus Peg"
- 2 White pegs The "Peril Pegs"

A bag to put them in



Playing the game

Divide the class into two teams and pre-prepare a set of questions.

When a team answers a question correctly they draw as many pegs as they like out of the peg bag. There is a catch!

- The green team scores 1 point for each green peg they draw out.
- The blue team scores 1 point for each blue peg they draw out.
- If a team draws out the other teams peg they neither lose or gain points.
- If either team draws out the pink Plus Peg they score 5 points.
- If either team draws out the white Peril Peg they lose all the points they have for that particular turn. They do not lose points from prior rounds.

The team can end their turn at any time.

The maximum points a team can score in one turn is ten.

Suspense makes this game work!

Note: The pegs do not need to be in the above colours, however the Peril Peg needs to be a colour like black, white, or red to emphasise that points will be lost.

Lunch Box Object Lesson Script

Props: Lunch box, vegemite sandwich, banana, muesli bar, pesto dip with vegetable sticks, Bible.

Note: Substitute the lunch box items with items you have at home, being mindful of including healthy options.



Say: Do you know what my favourite time of the day is? Lunch time!

Ask: Who else looks forward to lunch time?

Say: The reason why I look forward to lunch time is because my dad (or substitute for another person) makes the best lunches.

Ask: Would you like to see what dad's packed today? (Show lunch box and items one at a time.)

Say: A vegemite sandwich. Yum - that's my favourite.

And here's a banana. I have sports this afternoon so I'll need the energy. Look, he even drew a silly face on it!

Oohh, what's this!? A muesli bar. This was the last one in the cupboard. He must have kept it just for me.

And wow - there's homemade pesto dip. It must have taken dad a long time to pluck and wash the basil to make this so fresh.

I can't wait to eat this when I get home!
I wish you could meet my dad but you know, even though you haven't seen him, you already know something about him.
You know he makes incredible lunches.

Ask: What else can you discover about my dad? (Accept responses, such as kind, thoughtful, generous, funny).

Say: There's another person that I would love you to meet and that's God. We can't see God but we can know something

about him from what he's made. And what God has made is so much better than my lunch, as much as I can't wait to eat it.

In the Bible, there was a king called David who had discovered a lot about God, in fact he felt he knew God well. When David looked up into the sky and saw all of the amazing things that fill it, he discovered something about God.

Perhaps, you've spent time looking into the sky. It's fun to look at the shapes of clouds and to imagine that they're animals. I love looking at all of the beautiful colours that the sun makes when it rises and sets. Or at night when the moon can be seen along with the twinkling stars.

When David saw what God had made, he sang out, (Reading from Psalm 19:1) 'The heavens keep telling the wonders of God, and the skies declare (or show and tell us) what he has done.'

Ask: What do you think David discovered about God when he looked at the amazing things that God had made? (Accept responses, such as creative, powerful, amazing).

When David looked at the sky and everything that filled it, he realised how amazing and powerful God is. It filled him with such happiness that he thanked God and wanted to tell everyone how amazing God is. We too can discover how amazing God is from what he has made.



Script



Say: People often go to art galleries so they can look at and enjoy amazing works of art, like sculptures or paintings or installations.



Say: Sometimes, if you look carefully at the work of art, you can even see the artist's signature.

Ask: Can you spot it? Why do you think an artist includes their signature?

Artists sign their work so that people can know that they are the creator. It also is a way of showing everyone that they're proud of their work.



The Bible teaches that God planned, designed and made everything in this world, just like an artist. This world is like God's art gallery. Everywhere we look displays something amazing that God has made.



It's as if everything has God's signature on it.



King David looked up into the sky and he marvelled at what he saw. It was like the most incredible painting. The vivid colours of a sunrise and sunset.



The swirling patterns of the clouds.



The shapes of the moon and stars.



In Psalm 19, David wrote, 'The heavens tell about the glory of God. The skies show that his hands created them.' David could see God's signature all over the sky - he could see God's glory or power and it made him feel so thankful for what God had made.

We too can enjoy what God has made and know that he is a wonderful creator.







